

Saturday, September 24th

Duluth's Gems

Our first stop will be at the mouth of the Lester River to photograph sunrise over Lake Superior. The Lester River is known for its excellent steelhead and brook trout fishing.

Duluth's Rose Garden, located within Leif Erikson Park, offers over 3,000 rose bushes and other flora to photograph. The Rose Garden is a favorite location of local wedding and portrait photographers.



Enger Tower is an 80-foot, five story Brownstone observation tower sitting 450 feet atop the Duluth hills. Built in 1939, Enger Tower offers panoramic views of the western end of Lake Superior and the cities of Duluth, MN and Superior, WI. Enger Tower will be illuminated in red, on Thursday night, in honor of our NCCCC Convention.

We will next stop at the William A. Irvin ore carrier docked next to the Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center. The William A. Irvin was once the flagship of the U.S. Steel's Great Lakes Fleet. The Irvin is known for an ornate formal dining room, located on the deck of the vessel, just behind the front super structure. Her maiden voyage occurred on June 25, 1938. The William A. Irvin spent the next forty years hauling iron ore from Minnesota's Iron Range to the steel mills of the lower Great Lakes.



We'll finish at Duluth's famous Aerial Lift Bridge in Canal Park. You may have an opportunity to view abundant shipping activities from across the Great Lakes and the World via the St. Lawrence Seaway and Lake Superior. We will eat lunch here. Please make sure you purchase a ticket to attend, this includes transportation and a prepackaged lunch from the Radisson.

Don Tredinnick

I was introduced to photography by my grandfather. When I was around the age of 7, he gave me my first camera. I don't remember much about it other than it took 120 mm film. My next camera was a Kodak Instamatic that I carried with me everywhere. When I got to college, I took my next step when my friend Cheerios helped me purchase my first SLR, a Nikon EM with a 50mm lens. I have been using Nikon equipment ever since.



I enjoy shooting landscapes, wildlife, classic cars, old dilapidated buildings and equipment. I have been fortunate enough to visit some amazing locations, and I am always looking for new places to visit and experience. Some recent trips have been to Kaktovik Alaska, Galapagos Islands, Death Valley National Park

and Yellowstone National Park.

My photos have appeared in magazines, newspapers, calendars, and marketing materials. Some recent publications have been Lake Superior Magazine, 2017 Galapagos Conservancy Calendar, 2018 International Wolf Center calendar and The Virginian Pilot. I have also participated in various galleries around Minnesota.

Capturing Dynamic Landscape Photos

Capturing great landscape photos can be a challenge. Oftentimes, the result is nowhere near what we had experienced. The issue is that our cameras capture something different than what we experience. This is due to things like representing a 3-dimensional image in 2 dimensions, compression of the scene, wide angle distortion, and a host of other characteristics.

During this class, we will discuss how to create a dynamic landscape image. We will begin with compositional techniques, and finish with some more advanced topics such as focus stacking, storytelling, panoramas, and HDR.

Bob King

Bob King fell in love with the night sky and astronomy when he was a kid growing up in Illinois and loves to share his passion with people of all ages. Bob was a photographer and photo editor at the Duluth News-Tribune for 39 years before retiring from the paper in 2018.



His photography today is focused on nature and the night sky. When he's not outside looking at comets and galaxies, he writes the astronomy blog Astro Bob as well as articles for Sky & Telescope magazine and its website.

He's taught community education astronomy classes at the University of Minnesota-Duluth planetarium for many years, does a weekly program on KUMD-FM radio and biweekly Zoom presentations for Voyageurs National Park. His books "Night Sky with the Naked Eye" and "Wonders of the Night Sky You Must See Before You Die" describe the joys of sky watching. Bob's third book, "Urban Legends of Space" examines science vs. pseudoscience in astronomy.

Night-sky Photography on the Fly

How to be ready to photograph anything at night including that unexpected aurora. We'll also explore ways to anticipate astronomical events that make for cool photos so you don't miss a thing.

Friday, September 23rd

North Shore Exploration

The tour will begin at Duluth's famous Glensheen Mansion to photograph sunrise on the shores of Lake Superior.



Our next stop is the Two Harbors Lighthouse, which was constructed in 1892 and is the oldest operating light station in Minnesota. It's listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

We continue our exploration at Gooseberry Falls - the gateway to the North Shore. It is known for its spectacular waterfalls, river gorge, Lake Superior shoreline, Civilian Conservation Corps log and stone structures, and north woods wildlife. Lunch will be eaten at Gooseberry Falls. Please make sure you purchase a ticket to attend, this includes transportation and a prepackaged lunch from the Radisson.

Saturday, September 24th

Superior Hidden Gems

Your outing will start with a sunrise at Wisconsin Point, which is one of the largest freshwater sandbars in the world. Highlights include the Superior Entry, bird watching, and sunrise over Lake Superior.




Our second stop will be Amnicon State Park. Amnicon Park features a 55-foot-long Horton, or bowstring bridge, that is historically significant due to its age and unusual construction. Amnicon also features the brownstone rock outcroppings of the Douglas Fault running through the park. At one time, over one million cubic feet of Brownstone was quarried from within Amnicon State Park.

The final stop of this outing will be at Pattison State Park. The Park features the highest waterfall in Wisconsin at 165 feet high. This 1,400-acre park also has a lake with a beach and scenic hiking trails. Please make sure you purchase a ticket to attend, this includes transportation and a prepackaged lunch from the Radisson.

Friday, September 23rd

Duluth's Architecture

Visit locations around Duluth with an emphasis on street/urban photography. Start with doing sunrise at the historic Glensheen Mansion. Roam the grounds and take photos of the sunrise coming up over Lake Superior, the stone bridge over Tischer Creek, the historic buildings and outside of the mansion.




We will then move to the Lake Superior Train Museum located in the historic Depot in Downtown Duluth. Housed in the Historic Duluth Union Depot, the Lake Superior Railroad Museum houses the finest collection of Railroad Equipment in the country, with interactive exhibits as well as history from the region. We are working on getting actors in period clothing as well.

Sacred Heart Music Center is next on our list and the then called Sacred Heart Cathedral opened its doors in 1896, and installed its renowned Felgemaker organ in 1898. For years the towering Neo-gothic, three-spired brownstone served boom-town Duluthians seeking refuge from noise and industry in the harmonious chords and spiritual sense within its spacious nave.

Timeless

Afterwards, we will edit a few of our RAW photos using Lightroom and Photoshop. The editing portion is going to cover my workflow and RAW processing to prepare for posting on the web. Bring a charged laptop with Photoshop, Photoshop Elements, Lightroom or other editing software, but not required. Be ready for a rocking good time!

From Milky Way, to Orion, and Aurora; she finds the night sky to be an endless treasure trove of inspiration and awe. She has been involved with night photography for a number and years, and always strives to learn new things and help others discover the beauty of the cosmos.

Marybeth has served as an ambassador for the Michigan State Park system and an Artist-in-Residence for the Alaska State Park system. Her photos have been featured in many publications, including in National Geographic: Your Shot, Sky and Telescope, and was shortlisted in the 2022 Astronomy Photographer of the Year competition.

Duluth-Superior C.C. is now 89 years old

Founded under the name Camera Pictorialists of Duluth, earliest documentation indicates that the club was in existence as early as 1933. Sometime between 1934 and 1937, club members chose the name Duluth Camera Club. Our club adopted the Duluth-Superior Camera Club name in 1997.



The membership first gathered in an upper story hall over the then operating Eastman Kodak Store in Duluth. Dr. Frank H. Connor, assumed leadership of the club as its first president. Prospective photographers could join for a four dollar per year membership fee. Subsequent changes in meeting locations added darkroom areas for the members' use and enjoyment. Many of the club's printmakers have gone on to very successful studio photography careers in and around the Duluth area.

The Duluth-Superior Camera Club proposed N4C affiliation during the 1965 club year. The proposal passed by a unanimous vote in which the club is proud to have been an active member ever since. The second paragraph of the club's constitution states this desire for "the enjoyment, mastery, and furtherance of photography through cooperation, effort, and good fellowship."

The Apostle Supper Club




I have been working professionally as a photographer and photographic educator for forty years. During that time, I have worked on some amazing projects and with many incredible clients.

Enger Tower Honors 64th N4C Convention



On Thursday, September 22nd, the City of Duluth will light Enger Tower in N4C red to honor this year's convention held at the Radisson Duluth Harbor-view. It's quite an honor!

Enger Tower was constructed as a tribute to Bert Enger (1864-1931) a successful furniture salesman in Duluth and a native of Norway. Built in 1939 of native Bluestone, the five story tower offers panoramic views of the western end of Lake Superior and the cities of Duluth, MN and Superior, WI.

It is estimated that on a clear day you are able to view up to 30 miles away from the top level of the tower. The pinnacle on top of the tower's roof sits 531 feet above the surface of Lake Superior. Duluth's Enger Tower was dedicated on June 15, 1939 by Crown Prince Olav and Crown Princess Matha of Norway.

I'm a professional photographer & photography instructor who specializes in nightscapes and time-lapses. My passion and mission are to help you discover new ways to create incredible images and video clips - ones that you'll be excited to share with your family and friends.



Before his photography career took off, Mike Shaw was a physics and astronomy professor for over fifteen years. He also worked as an applied physics research scientist for over ten years. Yes, he is a rocket scientist!

Shaw says, "My photography expresses the freedom I feel when I'm outdoors in nature. My favorite images are those filled with the joy of being alive, a vital part of nature's web. I constantly look for that connection with the wildness of the natural world; untamed yet harmonious. My photographic quest is to merge both elements inside the camera as I search for those elusive glimpses of nature's perfection."

How to Set Up and Use a Star Tracker for Night Photography and Why

Portable star trackers have become widespread for night photography. They allow you to take very high-quality, low-ISO images of the night sky because they follow the sky's motion. You can use a tracker with your camera and regular lenses to capture detailed, wide-angle shots of the Milky Way, along with deep sky images of galaxies, star clusters and stunning gas nebulas. Here, you will learn what star trackers are, how to set one up, and how to use one. You'll also learn about the best deep-sky objects to explore and photograph, with plenty of examples.

Duluth ... The City of Duluth was officially named in 1856. The name Duluth is in recognition of French explorer Daniel Greysolon, Sieur du Lhut who first arrived in the area in 1679 to search of new fur trading routes.

I got started in nature and landscape photography as a hobby back in high school and in the last 7 years have taken a serious learning attitude towards making photography my professional career.



You will find everything from landscape, night, city landscape, wildlife, animals, sport, and portrait photography on my page. I also am an award-winning freelance photographer for local newspaper.

I was the president of the local Camera Club for two years, am a long-time admin for Frozen Photographer Facebook group, and guest speaker at Aurora Summit and Frozen Photographers Winter Gathering. I have also been printed in the local Pine Knot Newspaper and an anthology book "Social Gap Experiment" by Mellissa Kaelin.

Aerial Lift Bridge ... The Duluth shipping canal was not a naturally occurring feature of the Duluth Harbor and was dug out in 1871. The resulting canal cut off access to Park Point, which now had to be accessed by ferry.

In 1904-1905, the original version of the Aerial Lift Bridge was constructed. This was comprised of a ferry platform, suspended from the top of the bridge, that moved passengers and vehicles across width of the canal. The current lifting roadway was not added until 1929-1930.
